STUDYING ATTAINABLE AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING

As many families can attest – locally, regionally, and nationally – the attainability of quality, affordable housing is near crisis level. There is no simple solve, since the issues that underlie housing access are deep, broad, and diverse.

To that end, Madison County Community Foundation and South Madison Community Foundation have engaged Thomas P. Miller & Associates (TPMA) of Indianapolis to conduct a robust study of housing in Madison County. Specifically, to develop a deeper understanding of the local housing climate and the deeper issues at play, then determine approaches to address housing concerns while maximizing our distinct lifestyle advantages. This work is funded by a planning grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. through its Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT) initiative.

Following TPMA's comprehensive analysis of housing stock, condition, and market gaps, utilizing previously gathered data and

engaging with local stakeholders, the Foundations will have the opportunity to formulate an application through a competitive statewide process to potentially access a large scale grant which could help fund remedies.

Neither of the Foundations purport to be a subject-area expert in housing related fields of work, and we realize that many local entities are already engaged in addressing the varied complex issues around attainable housing. We also know there is no "one-size-fits-all" project or initiative that is applicable county-wide, as the housing issues faced by Pendleton residents are not the same as those faced in Alexandria, or Anderson, or Chesterfield, or elsewhere.

Because the scope of the issue extends beyond jurisdiction and manifests differently in each location, if you have data and/or expertise in this area, the Foundations seek your help in accessing content and connections to help create a broad knowledge base and community of support around this issue. Your input will help Madison County wrap its arms and minds around strategies to serve a broader community cause of supplying safe, attainable housing for all.



AS THE GRASS STARTS GROWING, SO DOES THE DEVELOPMENT IN MADISON COUNTY...

Winter has appeared to be fairly mild and short, and we head into Spring with exciting economic development announcements. We have four projects gearing up to open facilities in Madison County this year, with over \$150 Million dollars in investment and more than 300 new jobs! These projects, and the jobs that come with them, will have a tremendously positive impact on our local economy.

Many of our local workers currently travel outside of Madison County to find well-paying jobs, but thanks to these developments we will be able to keep our people, and dollars, within our County. The most recent Commuting Profile states Madison County loses 15,382 workers to neighboring counties, and receives 6,434 workers, top 5 of both shown to the right. We would like to retain all of the 15,000 currently leaving our County.

With about 200 project leads per year, our MCED office sees an array of industry types and sizes. Over the last 15 years Madison County has added more than 9,500 new jobs and \$3.5 Billion in new investment. This is due to our strategy of attracting a diversity of industries, and companies within them. Not to mention our diversity of Foreign Direct Investment, with 19 international companies from 9 different countries, and another one on the way. We will continue to seek out these types of projects as we attempt to keep our employees in Madison County, continue to grow the local small business economy alongside them, and expand our quality-of-life opportunities for everyone.
